Decipher the root causes of climate driven migration and get familiar with the tools to address different global challenges in educational settings and beyond

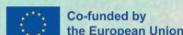
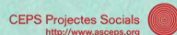
What topics will you cover?

- Environmental crisis and migration
- Cases studies of climate migration
- Global education methodology
- Decolonization of education and environmental crisis
- Storytelling methodology
- Youth perspectives on current environmental and social crises

What will you achieve?

By the end of the course, you'll be able to:

- Demonstrate an understanding of climate change and its consequences related to migration, global education approach to learning and education
- Learn about cases of climate migration
- Understand open questions and dilemmas connected to the (lack of) climate migration definitions



- Explain to your colleagues and peers the critical importance of global education approaches in creating a fully inclusive educational learning environment
- Identify and engage with the distinct legacies of colonialism and capitalism
- Identify and assess appropriate actions and approaches that would be effective in developing sustainable educational practices in your own educational and/or activist setting
- Design and lead an interview process in an intercultural environment that includes peers from Uganda, Myanmar, Bolivia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Spain
- Co-create stories connected to climate driven migration from Uganda, Myanmar, Bolivia, BiH and Spain that will be published in a printed booklet
- Meet interesting people and hear interesting stories from around the world

WHO IS THE COURSE FOR?

This course is aimed primarily at **youth workers, educators and activists thinking about practical tools to address diverse and complex global challenges**. This course will also be useful for people with migrant backgrounds, students of journalism, anthropology and future teachers. It also may appeal to general learners intrigued by the current surge of interest in the colonial and capitalistic legacies and what global education entails.

Online course consists of two parts, theoretical-experiential part and »field-work« part

1st part: theoretical-experiential part (Online course available in Slovene, Bosnian, German and Spanish):

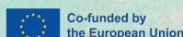
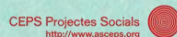
- DURATION: 6 weeks online course
- WEEKLY STUDY: 7-8 hours, self-paced

2nd part: »field work« (Mentoring youth - in English):

- DURATION: 2 weeks mentoring youth in global north countries in story-telling, interviewing skills to be able to co-create stories of climate migration together with the people from global south countries. Stories will be presented in a special printed booklet that will be translated to Slovenian, Spanish, German and English

3rd part: in person international training in Slovenia (in English)

- Four participants from each country (Austria, BiH, Spain, Slovenia) will get an opportunity to join in person training in Slovenia to upgrade their skill, knowledge and methodology connected to climate driven migration and be part of the International Conference of Global Education in Ljubljana, in 2023 focusing on climate driven migration
- DURATION: 4 days (November 2023)

TIMEFRAME

- Module 1 (Climate change and migration): opens 13.2.2023-27.2.2023 (self paced)

- Module 3 (Youth perspectives on global issues): opens 13.3.2023-27.3.2023 (self paced)
- Final assessment (only for those willing to receive certificate): 27.3.2023-3.4.2023

FAQ

- Does the course cost anything?

The course is completely free

- How much time will it take up?

There is one module every two weeks. Each module is roughly 15 hours long. The minimum time is, therefore, 15 hours/two weeks, but you can pursue your own interests and follow up using the recommended reading from each session. Mentoring youth will take up to 15 hours.

- What equipment do I need?

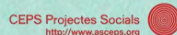
You need a device with a screen and an internet connection. To join the sessions live, your device will need to be able to access our webinar platform 'Zoom'.

- Are there any prerequisites?

No, you don't need any previous qualifications. We don't assume you have any previous experience in this field. However, it is vital there is a possibility to integrate newly gained knowledge to your work, studies... However, it is important to have a good level of English in case you enroll to all stages of the course.

- Is the course accredited by an academic institution?
